As you return to your residence, you may face some issues related to the fire:

Disruption of electrical service - contact Mora- San Miguel Coop, 1-800-421-6773

Disruption of phone service – contact CentryLink, 1-800-824-2877

Concerns about the integrity of your propane tank - contact your propane provider

Work crews in or along the roadways – drive slowly and expect delays

Increases in the number of wildlife looking for water and food

In the burned areas, watch out for:

Downed power lines

Trees or snags falling and/or blocking the road

Rock slides

Logs falling or rolling down the hillside

**Call 911** if you see something of concern, such as smoke or downed power lines. Be prepared to provide a detailed description of the issue and a specific location (it is helpful to provide landmarks to help the responders quickly locate the problem).
